

VILLAGE OF UNION CENTER DOG RULES AND LICENSE REQUIREMENTS

According to the Village of Union Centers Control of Animals Ordinance #134

Not more than one dog and one cat over the age of three months shall be kept at any residence within the Village of Union Center, excepting property which is located partially in both the Village of Union Center and the Town of Wonewoc. In the case of a multiple family dwelling, each apartment or residential unit is considered to be a residence. This ordinance went into effect September 16, 1998. Any dwelling having more than one dog or one cat before this date was allowed to keep that amount. However, In the event of death or forfeiture of the animal(s) the ordinance would be in effect for these dwellings.

No person shall, within the limits of the Village of Union Center, own, harbor or keep any animal which:

Habitually pursues vehicles upon a public way.

Assaults or attacks any person or destroys property or vegetation of another.

Is at large within the limits of the Village.

Habitually barks or howls to the annoyance of any person(s).

Kills, wounds or worries any other domestic animal.

Has been infected with rabies or been bitten by an animal infected with rabies.

DOG LICENSES AND COLLAR TAGS

The owner of a dog more than 5 months of age on January 1 of any year, or 5 months of age within the license year, shall annually, or on or before the date the dog becomes 5 months of age, pay the dog license tax and obtain a license.

The dog license tax is \$3 for a neutered male dog or spayed female dog. Proper documentation is required. The dog license tax is \$8 for an unneutered male dog or unspayed female dog, or one-half of these amounts if the dog became 5 months of age after July 1 of the license year.

Upon payment of the required dog tax, proper documentation of current rabies immunization is required.

The license year commences on January 1 and ends on the following December 31.

After issuing the license the collecting official shall deliver a tag bearing the same serial number as the license. This tag shall be securely attached to a collar and the collar with tag attached shall be kept on the dog for which the license is issued at all times. The dog is considered to be untagged if a valid license tag is not attached to a collar which is kept on the dog whenever the dog is outdoors unless the dog is securely confined in a fenced area.
